KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Continuously research and identify funders who are an excellent fit for WYZ and maintain an active pipeline of 20 prospective Trusts and Foundations.
- Focus on grants ranging from £1,000 to £25,000 and submit between 4 and 8 grant applications per month.
- Secure £150,000 per year in new grants income to support WYZ Universal Programmes (reviewed quarterly).
- Collaborate with the Head of Youth Work and the Universal Youth Work Team to understand the needs of the organisation and projects and align applications accordingly.
- Consult directly with children and young people at the Youth Zone to understand their needs and aspirations and include the voice of young people in all grant applications.
- Ensure that each funder's requirements for Reporting are met. Work alongside delivery staff to ensure that Monitoring and Evaluation is carried out on projects, that all required information is provided, and encourage a culture of impact reporting.
- To Submit all funder reports ahead of relevant deadlines.
- Go beyond reporting expectations by providing excellent stewardship of each funder and nurture relationships by hosting meetings and Youth Zone tours and attending regional events.
- Closely collaborate with the Head of Grants & Contracts to ensure that all activity aligns with the charity's Fundraising Strategy, and that the Vision, Mission, and Values of the organisation are being met.
- Collaborate with other G&T Fundraisers in the OnSide network and attend quarterly G&T Forum meetings.
